LIBRARY DELIVERY SERVICES



Did you know ICP partners with local libraries to provide library materials to older adults who cannot get to the library?

Every two weeks, ICP volunteers deliver books and other library materials to your door. After two weeks, a volunteer will pick up the materials to be returned to the library and drop off a new batch. Materials can include books, movies/DVDs, CDs and magazines.

We currently work with libraries in Brookfield, Hodgkins, La Grange, La Grange Park, North Riverside, Western Springs, Westmont, and with Indian Prairie Public Library, which serves Darien, Willowbrook and parts of Burr Ridge.


Any words of wisdom you try to live by?
