

Please schedule your early January rides BEFORE December 20th as no one will be answering calls or scheduling rides during office closures. The first day of rides in 2024 will be January 3rd.

When scheduling a ride to a medical appointment, please have the physician name, phone number and exact address. We can only enter rides into our system when we have the complete address. Thank you!

HEALTH PRECAUTIONS

As always, please kindly cancel your ride if you are feeling ill. Just call the office and we will be happy to help you reschedule for a later date!

WINTER WEATHER POLICY

In the event of dangerously low temperatures or blizzard-type weather conditions, we will cancel rides, notify drivers and clients, and assist with rescheduling. If you have questions or need to reschedule, please contact the office.

What part of ICP's mission speaks to you most? Client connections and interaction via the phone. It is so nice to greet clients one on one!



Cozy Up with a Batch of Papa's Texas Chili!

ICP volunteer driver and former Board president Ben Boyd took 1st Place at the La Grange Park Chamber Chili Cookoff with this winning recipe!

2 lbs. 1.5" thick round steak

1 lb. fresh pork sausage

1-28 oz. can Italian tomatoes

4 oz. jar of jalapeno peppers (remove seeds)

1 T chili powder

1 T brown sugar

3 medium onions, diced (plus more for serving)

4 cloves of garlic, diced

1 t oregano

1 t cumin

3 bay leaves

2 T olive oil

1 box elbow macaroni Shredded cheddar Trim fat from steak and cut into 1 inch squares. Place in skillet and render the meat—remove rind and fry steak cubes in rendered fat until browned on all sides. Add pork sausage and cook until no longer pink. Add chili powder and turn off skillet.

In another skillet heat olive oil and sauté onions, garlic and jalapeno peppers until onions are caramelized. Place meat and vegetables in soup pot and tomatoes, cumin, oregano, brown sugar and bay leaves. Simmer for 4-5 hours. Remove from heat and remove bay leaves.

Serve with elbow macaroni, cheese, diced jalapenos and chopped onions. Can add beans on the side (already cooked).
